We also bring you news of recent publications from Barnardos including our latest issue of ChildLinks on Children's Participation, as well as information on upcoming training events and new library titles.



ChildLinks - Children's Participation (Issue 2, 2021)

Earlier this year, DCEDIY published the *National Framework for Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making*. The Framework is to be much welcomed as it plays an important role in ensuring that Ireland is a country where all children and young people are respected and listened to, and where the views of children and young people are at the heart of government decision-making.




The Role of the Childminder in Early Learning
