

Suggested activities based on A Dublin Fairytale

Literacy

- In our story Fiona visited the Witches' Market in Moore Street
- The Poison Apples were 10 for 2euro, how many apples could you buy for 1 euro0?
- The magic Soda costs 50c per glass, how many glasses could you buy for 3euro?
- Each glass of magic Soda holds 250 ml how many glasses will I need to fill a litre bottle?

History

- Find out about any one of these landmarks in Dublin city centre
- The Ha'penny Bridge over the River Liffey
- Trinity College
- The Spire

Geography

- Follow Fiona's journey on a map of central Dublin
- Draw your own map of a journey you make often

Drama

- Teacher or grown up at home goes into 'Role' pretending he or she is the 'Wolf'
- Children think about the questions they want to ask the 'Wolf' so as to try and understand the 'Wolf's' behaviour. They can chat how they will approach the 'Wolf' will they be cross with him or friendly towards him? They can write these out and practise saying them aloud with their partner. They can plan who will ask the first question, how the meeting will continue and what they can do if there is a problem.
- The Drama space is set up and the meeting between the children and the 'Wolf' begins

SPHE

- In our story Fiona's new friends came to the rescue when she was in trouble. Talk to your partner or a grown up at home about a time when you got help from your friends(s)
- Even though Fiona was in a hurry to get to her granny's house she was kind to the giant and the troll and the dragon when they were in trouble. Think of someone you could be kind to today and decide what you will do for them.
