### Benefits to schools who partner with us – a suite of education programmes:

Should your school decide to partner with us we will provide free of charge a commitment to visit the school (at scheduled times) and liaise with the various coordinator(s) to deliver educational programmes in line with their needs and requirements.

We are in a position to deliver one or all of the programmes below:

### Internet Safety & Cyberbullying (students, teachers & parents):

We deliver talks to both parents and students on the issue of Bullying and Cyberbullying. This is a growing area of concern for parents, teachers and students alike. However, equipped with up to date information, you can ensure you are fully informed. Such a programme would be suitable for the junior and senior cycle.

### Rights education workshops:

Rights and their understanding is covered in the CSPE curriculum and culminates with an Action Project which often addresses themes of children's rights, abuse and social justice. Barnardos emphasis on Advocacy and children's rights is covered in this presentation and gives students an up-to-date overview of current issues in the area as well as providing useful resource links for further information.
